Park Committee Report:

With the extension to and refurbishment of Hillside complete that has concluded the current major trail works within the park. Angry Goat Trails has been asked to return to the park in the future to conduct some rework/repairs in south park. A park management Committee meeting was help August and a review of the recent work by AGT was conducted. The committee agreed to write a formal letter to AGT asking them to address some issues with the trail and have an informal chat.

A majority of trail fairies have not been looking after their trails and some parts of the park will require long term maintenance to return them to IMBA standards. Alyssa and crew have done an amazing job on Yellow brick road.

140 tonnes of Red soil was delivered to the picnic area with a view to rebuilding the kids orange track.

After the meeting PMC was held it became clear to me that I was unable to lead the PMC in the direction I believe it needed to head. Due to this I have stepped down to allow for the new leadership to address the issues that arise and take the park in a new direction. It is important to note that it is my belief that PMC had become distracted by issues that will halt progress within the park. Too much red tape will drive away those wanting expand/develop the amazing facility that we have.

General business

1. Resignation of Peter Thistle from the Park Management Committee (AR)

Discussion:

- It has been an intense time, project managing 2 new builds so close to each other
- The Park Management Committee (PMC) has a good base structure,
- There is a lack of clarity around the decision making process, it needs to be tightened up and followed more closely in future
- Expectations of future builds need to be made in writing in advance of the actual build
- Trails have been neglected lately, there needs to be more communication between the PMC and the Trail Fairies
- Give the Trail Fairies a stronger brief regarding expectations and responsibilities
- The PMC is responsible for ensuring the trails are safe and meet IMBA standards and guidelines, trail fairies (and others) can't just start builds and projects without following the procedures

Motion: There should be a representative from the Tamworth Mountain Bikers Committee on the Park Management Committee. The Park Management Committee needs to meet to discuss leadership, trail fairies, weed management.

Action: Ross Aylwin was nominated and accepted the position of Committee Representative on the Park Management Committee. Alyssa to meet with current remaining members of PMC to assist with selection of a Chairperson and to introduce Ross.

- 5. Fund raising for electronic keypad entry (AR)
 - Quote from Tamworth Fencing for a keypad entry to the park
 - Able to allow remote access to the park via a phone app
 - Wait until we have a price, then apply for grant funding
 - Alysa Rogan to work through the process
 - All in favour
- 6. Justin Roberts chair (PT)
 - Roberts family abstained from voting due to a conflict of interest
 - We should pay Justin Roberts for the chair he made, \$200.00 is a very fair price for it
 - Justin to meet up with the Park Management Committee to finalise the placement of the seat

Motion: to pay Justin Roberts \$200.00 for his time and materials. Lisa to forward JB Justion; s bank details to enable a bank transfer.

- TRC sends us a report showing that we have spent the funds totaling \$112,018.40
- We can then receive our second milestone payment.

- 8. To enable signage for Yellow Brick Road and Creekline new measurements are required (JB)
- Could someone get the information? (RA)
- Crummy and Ross Aylwin will organise information collection
- Proposing a double sided sign on the bitumen road, not impacting slashing etc., with a scene from the yellow brick road including distance, elevation, etc. On the other side a map of the park, pictures of birds that can be found in the park. Agreed
- 9. Walking Trail shelters Skyline and Southridge. (JB)
- Recommend installation of shade sails instead of metal structures, can be purchased or donated
- Rotary can potentially donate the steel for supports
- Why is final decision not going to PMC?
- PMC investigating the engineering specs Lisa Roberts needs the lot number to be able to investigate the structural requirements needed

Action: PMC to complete investigation and make decision, submission to be forwarded to PMC

- 10. Temporary "race course" signs to be made up. "Race", directional arrows, etc. Can be erected at intersection points, neater than handwritten signs, could complement the "Fast and Furious" signs we already have (RA)
- Jeff Benson to get costings from Lloyds Signs and report back to the group
- 15 signs already on hand which could be repurposed by Peter Thistle
- Corflute certificates could also be reused as temporary signs

- Ross Aylwin will look into how many of each one we need
- 11. Grant application for sporting equipment (up to \$10K), possibly to purchase timing equipment (LR)
- 2 grants available around increasing active participation in sport
- Could we put in a submission for a kids kit?
- Could we bid for timing equipment?
- Get a few bikes to hire out?
- Lisa Roberts to follow up

12. Return to in person racing prior to Twilight Series (PT)

- Twilight will be back next term
- Virtual challenge stats are increasing, potentially more riders will join in the next 2 fortnights
- Simpler tracks are helping
- Several riders only came to our race because they had competed in virtual challenges
- See item 4 for further details

13. Adaptive cyclist signs for trail (PT)

- Good publicity, but we do not have registered adaptive signs in the park
- Need the signs to assist adaptive riders in following the correct trail
- New track maps, can we indicate adaptive tracks somehow?
- Alyssa Rogan will look into the requirements, costs, etc.

Motion: To organise the signs for Southpark first, and then expand out to other trails if they are proved suitable for adaptive cycles.
